Those tiny nutritious bodies are the keys to that lock.

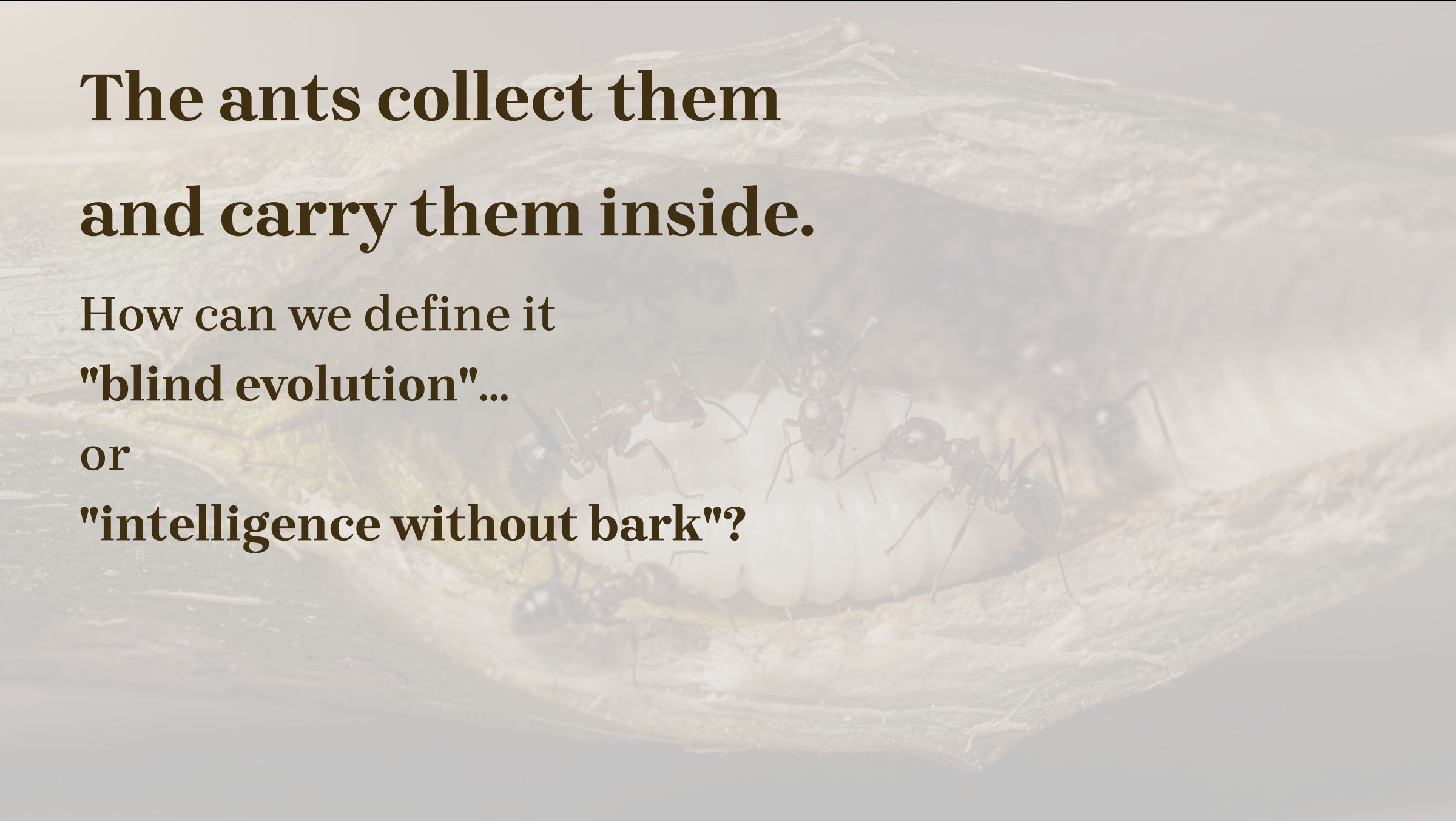
